





Alice in Wonderland workshops

The visit of a touring theatre company was used as a starting point to engage children with aspects of numeracy. These were followed up with arts workshops in school led by artist Cath Moran, where the arts activities linked in particular with scale. Six leading maths teaching new resources were created that can be used by teachers to prepare, plan and follow up in school linking aspects of Alice in Wonderland to specific work units.


