### About the role

An exciting opportunity has arisen to join Sapling Gallery as Curatorial and Gallery Assistant. This role sits with the small founding team and will take place at the gallery in Mayfair, though may involve research trips to libraries and galleries as required. You will assist and support the gallery team to deliver exhibitions and events; to research future exhibition ideas, new artists, and to write texts for Sapling's website and social media.

The STEP placement will train a curatorial and gallery assistant in two things. How to come up with an exhibition from start to finish, and how to run a gallery exhibition operationally.

#### **Key duties**

- To be an ambassador for Sapling
- Greeting and interacting with visitors and providing information about the artworks when necessary
- To safeguard works of art when open to the public
- Researching artists and exhibition concepts as requested, gathering information from National Libraries and online to then write summaries
- Coming up with ideas for content about artists and the gallery's projects for social media
- Helping with the writing, editing, and researching of gallery invitations, artist invite packages, catalogue texts, biographic and bibliographic material, press releases, and exhibition fact sheets
- Preparing loan forms and master checklists
- Updating and keeping accurate records

STEP is a training programme for young East Londoners local to the Olympic Park, who are ready to bring ideas, creative energy and perspectives to the creative and cultural sector.

You must be;

- Aged 18 to 30
- Resident of Hackney, Newham, Tower Hamlets and Waltham Forest and have attended school or college in these boroughs

Through STEP, you'll get paid London Living Wage over a 12-month training programme to develop a range of skills and creative approaches and build on your network across different organisations or departments. You'll complete a work-based placement, grow as part of a peer network, take part in regular professional development workshops, and get a budget to produce a collaborative project. We'll also connect you with a specialist industry mentor, provide careers coaching and continue to offer support as part of our community after the programme.
