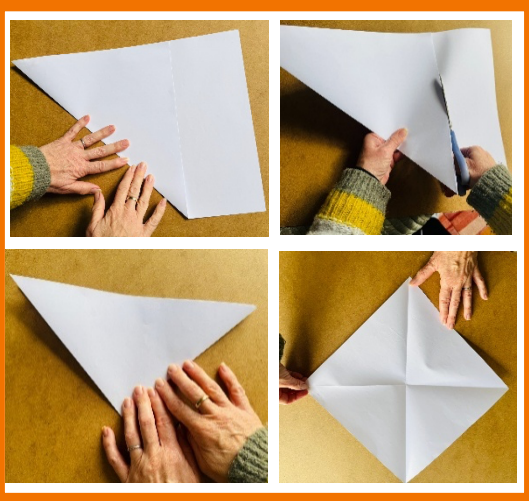


3. Prepare your Kite

Create a square from an A3 sheet by folding the top corner down so it meets about a third of the way along the bottom edge.

Cut and keep the remaining rectangle to use later for the kite tails.

Divide the square into four sections by folding it into four triangles - this will form their kite.



4. Scent mapping

In each kite section, children can write and draw:

- A scent they remember or imagine
- The place, person, or story it connects to
- How that smell makes them feel

Encourage both real and imaginary ideas. Children can decorate their maps with colours, symbols, or patterns that match each scent and feeling.

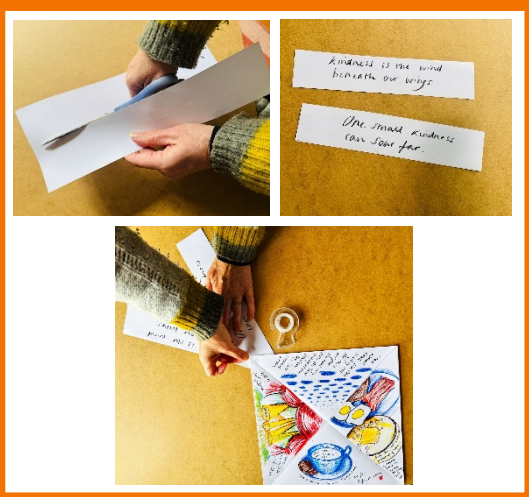


5. Messages on the wind

On the remaining rectangle from your original piece of A3 paper, cut it in half length ways, and attach to a corner of your kite to make your kite tails.

Pupils can write short messages or wishes inspired by their scent journey, such as:

- Dreams for the future
- Ideas about freedom or kindness
- Thoughts about where their kite might travel or the dreams it carries



6. Let's go fly a kite

Share kites with the class using prompts like: *I notice... I wonder... It makes me feel...*

Display the kites in the classroom or corridor to celebrate their memories and imagination!
